This is new and will be at a slightly higher cost than school delivery - \$7 increase. It would eliminate the need for volunteers and it would eliminate the burden on the teachers for unpacking and disposal of the boxes. Parents could do the sorting prior to the begin of school with all the other parents.</p> <p>Auction Committee Theme - Roaring 20s Date - See discussion under president's update.</p> <p>Legislative Committee - Michael Blick Election is 2 weeks away - please vote in Nov.</p> <p>Proposition CC proposes amending the Colorado statutes to allow the state government to keep all of the money it collects every year beginning in the 2019-20 state budget year; and requires that any money the state government keeps over its existing revenue limit be spent for public schools, higher education, and transportation projects, rather than returned to taxpayers.</p> <p>What your vote means: A "yes" vote on Proposition CC means the state can keep all of the money it collects over its revenue limit to spend on education and transportation.</p>	<p>Parents wish to continue having it delivered to school, but would offer assistance to the teachers to unpack boxes etc.</p>

	<p>A "no" vote on Proposition CC means that any money the state collects over its revenue limit must be returned to taxpayers.
